Any construction work as performed within the definitions listed here below, all of which, taken together are "Heavy-Highway Construction" work:

"HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION" work is defined as work performed to provide a facility to accommodate vehicular or pedestrian traffic and includes, but is not limited to, the construction of all streets, roads, expressways, turnpikes, bridges, drainage structures, grade separations, parking lots, rest areas, alleys, sidewalks, guardrails, fences, and sound barriers, but shall not include construction of buildings.

"AIRPORT CONSTRUCTION" work is defined as including site preparation, grading, paving, drainage, fences, sidewalks, driveways, parking areas and similar work incidental to the construction of airfields but shall not include the construction of buildings.

"HEAVY CONSTRUCTION" work is defined as including, but not limited to grade separations, foundations (does not include building foundations), abutments, retaining walls, shafts, tunnels, subways, elevators, drainage projects, flood control projects, reclamation projects, reservoirs, water supply projects, water development projects, hydro-electric development, utility transmission lines, including right-of-way clearing, locks, dams, dikes, levees, revetments, channels, channel cutoffs, intakes, dredging projects, jetties, breakwater, docks, harbors; and all municipal and utility construction except construction classified as building construction.

"POLLUTION CONTROL, SEWAGE PLANT, WASTE PLANT AND WATER TREATMENT FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION" WORK shall be all work in construction of pumping stations, waste and sewage disposal plants, incinerator plants, water treatment plants, filtration plants, solid waste disposal and similar pollution control facilities.

"SOLAR & WIND FARM" WORK is considered "HEAVY CONSTRUCTION" and includes all work in the construction of solar fields/farms and wind fields/farms (not installations on buildings).

INTEGRATED FIBERGLASS PUMP STATION

PART 1 GENERAL

1.01 SCOPE

- A. Work under this Section includes but is not limited to furnishing and installing a factory built duplex fiberglass pump station as indicated on the project drawings, herein specified, as necessary for proper and complete performance.
- B. This Section includes the furnishing and installing of the pumping equipment and integrated below ground valve vault as shown on the Drawings, as scheduled herein, and as specified herein.
- C. The integrated below ground valve unit shall be constructed, pre-piped and assembled to the fiberglass pump station to facilitate field installation of a monolithic structure. The unit shall be fiberglass and consist of connection piping, fittings, check valves, isolation valves, and bypass with cam lock.
- D. The control panel unit shall consist of communications and manual transfer switch housed in a stainless steel NEMA 4X enclosure. The unit shall rest upon the leveled wet well wall and/or a precast concrete top slab.
- E. All Work performed under this Section shall be in accordance with all approved trade practices and manufacturers' recommendations.
- F. The Contractor shall provide all work not provided or supplied by the pump station equipment supplier.

1.02 SUBMITTALS

- A. Submittals shall be in accordance with the requirements of Section 01300 and shall include:
 - 1. Shop Drawings for Review:
 - a. Manufacturer's warranty.
 - b. Manufacturer certification /affidavit.
 - c. Manufacturer's product data literature.
 - d. Manufacturer's certified pump test curves
 - e. Information and data concerning the materials of construction, salient components and details of construction of equipment and components.
 - 2. Information for the Record:
 - a. Manufacturer's certified test curves, indicating capacity, head, efficiency, brake horsepower and speed. No pump shall be shipped to the job site until the test curves have been submitted and reviewed.

- b. Manufacturer's certification of installation and operation.
- c. Manufacturer's certification the equipment is suitable for the intended use.
- d. Manufacturer's installation instructions.
- e. Operation and maintenance manual.
- f. Startup Report.

1.03 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Manufacturer Warranty and Service Packages:
 - 1. Warranty Submittals - At the time of shop drawing submittal, the Contractor shall submit a written warranty from the manufacturer(s) covering workmanship and materials on all pumps and equipment.
 - 2. Warranty period shall be a prorated five-year term for pumping equipment.
 - 3. Warranty period shall be a two-year term for the fiberglass pump station and integrated valve vault.
 - 4. Warranty period shall be one year for all other equipment supplied under this Specification.
 - 5. The warranty period shall commence on the date of Substantial Completion.
 - 6. Under terms of this warranty, the manufacturer shall furnish and install all replacement parts for any defective component at no cost to the Owner. The provisions of this warranty shall not be construed as relieving or reducing the obligations of the Contractor outlined in the General Conditions of these Specifications.
- B. Each pump shall be shop tested in accordance with standards of the Hydraulic Institute. Pump performance shall meet acceptance grade 2B. Six copies of certified test curves indicating capacity, head, efficiency, brake horsepower, and speed shall be submitted to the Engineer for approval. No pump shall be shipped to the job site until the test curves have been approved by the Engineer.
- C. The wet well shall be classified as a Class 1, Group D, Division 1, environment.

PART 2 PRODUCTS

2.01 UNITARY RESPONSIBILITY

- A. To unify responsibility for proper operation of the complete pumping station, it is the intent of these Specifications that all system components be furnished by a single supplier (unitary source). The pumping station must be of standard catalog design, totally warranted by the manufacturer of the pump station. Under no circumstances will a system consisting of parts compiled and assembled by the Contractor be accepted.

2.02 MANUFACTURER / SUPPLIER

- A. The specifications and project drawings depict equipment and materials manufactured by Excel Fluid Group. The contractor shall prepare the bid based on the specified equipment for purposes of determining low bid. Award of a contract shall constitute an obligation to furnish the specified equipment and materials.

2.03 STATION WET WELL AND INTEGRATED VALVE VAULT

- A. The pump station wet well and integrated valve vault shall be below ground that houses all valves and piping components necessary for routine maintenance and operations.
- B. The wet well and integrated valve vault unit shall be filament wound fiberglass structure and conform to ASTM D3753.
- C. The unit shall capable of withstanding 200 pcf at maximum bury depth and have a Barcol hardness of at least 90%.
- D. A fiberglass or steel anti-flotation collage shall extend a minimum of 3-inches beyond to the outside diameter of the wet well.
- E. All metal accessories within the pump station shall be 316 stainless steel.
- F. Guide Rail Assembly: Factory plumbed for pump and motor installation and removal by Owner's staff from the surface. Slide rails, support brackets, and pipe/pump connection hardware shall be fabricated of stainless steel suitable for resisting sanitary sewage corrosivity.
- G. Access Door(s):
 - 1. Door leaf shall be 1/4-inch aluminum diamond pattern plate reinforced with aluminum stiffeners designed to withstand H20 load rating and as required to prevent distortion of the leaf when in any position. Doors shall be equipped with heavy forged brass hinges, stainless steel pins, spring operators for easy operation, and automatic hold-open arm with release handle. A snap lock with removable handle shall be provided.
 - 2. A 1-1/2-inch drainage coupling shall be provided in the door frame. Drainage shall be piped by the Contractor to outlet with 1-1/2-inch PVC pipe to drain or as shown on the Drawings. Unless shown otherwise, all door drains shall be routed through slabs to drain into adjacent backfill.
 - 3. Hardware shall be stainless steel throughout.
 - 4. Factory finish shall be mill finish with bituminous coating applied by the manufacturer to the exterior of the frame and all aluminum in contact with concrete.
 - 5. Doors shall be as manufactured by Bilco, Halliday Products or approved equal.

H. Access Door Fall Protection:

1. Each hatch shall be designed to combine covering of the opening, fall-through protection per OSHA standard 1910.23 and controlled confine space entry per OSHA standard 1910.146.
2. The safety grate shall be made of 6061-T6 aluminum and designed per the “Specifications for Aluminum Structures”, by the Aluminum Association, Inc. 5th Edition, December 1986 for “Bridge Type Structures.”
3. The grating shall be designed to withstand a live load of 300 pounds per square foot. Deflection shall not exceed 1/150th of the span.
4. Grate openings shall allow for visual inspection, limited maintenance, and float adjustments while safety grate fall-through protection is left in place. The grating shall cover the full opening except for a maximum 6-inch width on each end of the opening.
5. Design must assure that the fall-through protection is in place before the doors can be closed, thereby, protecting the next operator.
6. Each grate shall be provided with a permanent hinging system, which will lock the grate in the 90-degree position once opened.
7. Each grate supplied with a locking device (for Owner’s padlock) that will prevent unauthorized entry to the confined space. The grating system will allow anyone to make visual inspection and float adjustments without entering the confined space.
8. Grate shall be coated with an OSHA-type safety orange or yellow color, promoting visual awareness of the hazard. The aluminum safety grates shall receive a two-coat, powder coating system, applied by the electrostatic spray process. The base coat is a thermosetting epoxy powder coat finish with a minimum thickness of 2 to 4 mils. The top coat is a mar-resistant, TGIC polyester powder coating with a minimum thickness of 2 to 4 mils. Each coat shall be baked at 450 to 375 degrees F until cured.
9. Welding shall be in accordance with ANSI/AWS D1.2-90 Structural Welding Code for Aluminum.

2.04 SUBMERSIBLE PUMP DESIGN

- A. The pump and motor assembly shall be designed for continuous submerged operation at the bottom of the wet well and to be easily removable from the top surface of the wet well without any human entrance into the wet well required. The unit will be designed to connect with the wet well discharge piping by sliding down two stainless steel rails mounted inside the wet well. Pumps and motors furnished shall be complete with all necessary components to provide a functional and long-lasting dependable system. This includes, but is not necessarily limited, to the following:

1. Pumps shall be an explosion-proof, solids handling, grinder pump designed specifically for handling raw, unscreened, domestic, and light industrial sanitary sewage with high capacity and high head capability.
 2. Impeller: Impellers shall be recessed vortex design to reduce clogging and constructed of ASTM A-48 Ductile Iron to protect from corrosion and breakage. Impeller shall be dynamically balanced to ISO G6.3 tolerances.
 3. Casing: Casing shall be Cast Iron ASTM A48 Class 30 and come complete with mounting feet to prevent tipping or binding.
 4. Pumps shall include sensors for detection of seal failure, and motor temperature.
 5. Power/Sensor Cord: AWG rated submersible pump cable sized accordingly to the motor supplied and the National Electric Code, not allowing a voltage drop of more than 5% from the panel to the motor. The power cord shall include power and sensor wires and have a water-tight, quick disconnect (Meltric or Hubble), type 4X, water and gas tight design, plug-and-play cord end to simplify installation and maintenance operations. The power and sensor wiring combination cord shall be water-proof end connector at the motor and the power and control panels of sufficient length to remove the pump.
 6. Lifting Bail: Large Stainless-Steel bail for easy installation and removal.
 7. Hardware: Stainless steel to provide resistance against corrosion.
 8. Finish: Epoxy coated factory finish for submersible wastewater application.
 9. Pump Performance Requirements:
 - a. Design Performance Point: 80 gpm at 40-ft Total Dynamic Head.
 - b. Impeller Diameter: 7.125-inches.
 - c. Pumps shall be Barnes model 4SEV-DS, Myers model 4R/4RX, or equal.
- B. Motor:
1. The motor shall be explosion proof, Class 1, Division 1 Group C & D, 240V, 3 phase, 60 HZ submersible motor operating at no higher than 1,750 RPM.
 - a. Horsepower shall be sized per the Performance Criteria.
 - b. Motor shall be oil filled for lubrication and cooling.
 - c. Motors shall be tested in accordance with provisions of ANSI/IEEE.
 2. Shaft: The pump shaft shall be threaded #416 steel designed to carry maximum torque.
 3. Shaft Keys: shall be constructed of #416 stainless steel.
 4. Mechanical Seals: Tandem carbon / ceramic vs. silicon / carbide seals with oil filled seal chamber.

2.05 VALVES, PIPING, SUPPORTS AND GAUGES

- A. All piping, valves and materials shall be suitable for use in a municipal wastewater application.
- B. Valves:
 - 1. Check Valves: (2) G.A. lever and weight swing check valves with flanged connections, AWWA C508 with ductile iron ASTM A536 body and epoxy coated for wastewater service.
 - 2. Plug Valves: (2) Milliken eccentric plug valves with flanged connections, AWWA C504 with cast iron A126 class B body, rubber coated ductile iron plug and epoxy coated for wastewater service.
- C. Piping:
 - 1. Piping in the wet well and integrated valve vault shall be ductile iron and shall conform to ANSI A21.51 or AWWA C151.
 - 2. Flanged fittings shall be ductile iron and conform to ANSI A2115 or AWWA C115. All fittings shall have a pressure rating of 250 psi for all pipe sizes unless otherwise specified.
- D. Support and Braces:
 - 1. Piping system shall be connected to the wet well and integrated valve vault in sturdy fashion designed to prevent pipe static and dynamic loads from being transmitted to pumps or any other pump station piping.
 - 2. Pump station discharge force main piping shall be anchored where required.
 - 3. Breakaway fittings shall be provided for the pump connection.
- E. Gauges:
 - 1. One glycerin-filled pressure gauge is to be at least 4-inches in diameter, graduated in feet of water column (0 to 140 feet water column minimum) is to be provided. Gauge to be installed with an isolation ring to reduce the potential of sewage from entering the gauge.
 - 2. Gauge to be mounted downstream of the pump check valve(s).

2.06 STATION PIPING AND VALVES

- A. Discharge Pipe: Ductile iron discharge piping shall connect to the stationary discharge base/elbow lift assembly and terminate at a 4-inch NPT stainless steel discharge flange mounted on the basin at the height shown in the plans.
- B. A stainless steel flexible connector of at least 9-inch long shall connect the discharge plumbing within the pump station to the force main. This is designed to prevent the ground settlement from busting off the force main from the basin.

- C. Shut Off Valve: A PVC union ball type shut off valve with Teflon seats shall be furnished as an integral part of the internal pipe assembly. An extension handle shall be supplied to operate the Shut off valve from the surface.

2.07 PANEL STAND

- A. Construction: The panel stand shall be constructed of stainless steel for corrosion resistance and of adequate thickness to provide stability and mechanical strength. The panel stand shall have a hinged cover that is held in place by 3 stainless tool box locking hasps so that the cover may easily be opened without the use of special tools. Panel stand designs that use screws to mount the cover shall not be acceptable.
- B. Panel stand Vent cover shall be designed so as not to allow bugs or foreign objects to enter.
- C. Banjo eye mounting bracket shall be provided as a strain relief to prevent strain on the cable entry in bottom of the control panel.
- D. Stainless steel escutcheon ring shall be provided to cover stainless steel mounting bolts.
- E. Panel stand shall provide a wire way to prevent power / float cords from exposure to sunlight and UV as well as from shock hazard & vandalism.

2.08 LEVEL CONTROLS

- A. Level Floats: Lead pump on/off, lag pump on, and alarm levels shall be controlled by 4 mercury float switches. Switches shall consist of a mercury tube switch sealed in a corrosion resistant polypropylene housing with a minimum of 18 gauge, 2 wire, SJOW/A jacketed cable. The cable shall be of sufficient length to reach the junction box with no splices. The basin level controls shall be mounted on a SS bracket. Level controls shall be UL/CSA listed. Floats shall be furnished with a water / gas tight pin & sleeve connector.
- B. Pump Control: The level control system shall start and stop the pumps in accordance to the wet well level. Upon operator selection of automatic operation, a float switch shall start one pump motor when water rises to the "Lead Pump Start" level. When the water is lowered to the "Low Level/Pump Off" level, the system shall stop this pump. Should the water continue to rise above the lead pump level float, an additional "Lag Pump Start/High Level Alarm" level float switch will start the second pump and actuate the high level alarm. Circuit design in which application of power to the lag pump motor starter is contingent upon completion of the lead pump circuit shall not be acceptable.
- C. Alternator: The level control system shall work in conjunction with an alternator relay to select first one pump, then the second pump, to run as "Lead" pump. Alternation will occur at the end of each pumping cycle.
- D. The pump control shall provide the following features: dry run protection, phase monitoring, and elapsed time meters.

2.09 CONTROL PANEL

- A. Construction: A NEMA 4X stainless steel control panel shall be furnished, as shown on the plans.
1. The enclosure shall be of one-piece, weatherproof construction with smooth, rounded corners and shall be constructed to have a smooth exterior and interior. The enclosure shall be fitted with a closed cell neoprene gasketed cover. The enclosure shall be provided with back panel mounting provisions.
 2. The cover shall be hinged with a heavy-duty corrosion resistant stainless steel piano hinge. The cover shall be lockable by means of 2 high-quality combination stainless steel latches and padlock hasps.
 3. The enclosure shall be provided with external mounting feet on the top and bottom of the enclosure.
 4. The back panel shall be a minimum of 0.080-inch aluminum and held in place by 4 No. 10 screws, which will mate to the 4 threaded standoffs, which are molded into the enclosure.
- B. Electrical Components:
1. The panel shall include a double pole 20 amp main disconnect breaker, alarm circuit fuse, control circuit fuse, I.E.C. rated motor contactor, Klixon overload, pump hand/off/auto switch (momentary in the hand position), pump run lights, seal leak lights, start and run capacitors, start relay, terminal blocks, ground lug and all necessary wiring and brackets.
 2. The control panel shall be fitted with a red Texan (polycarbonate) alarm light. The light shall be approximately 3-inch high by 3-inch diameter. The globe shall be mounted on top of the enclosure with a neoprene gasket. The lens cannot be removed from the exterior of the enclosure. The lens may be removed by entering the interior of the enclosure and removing 4 No. 8 screws. The bulb shall be 40 watt minimum high intensity medium base type. The bulb shall be easily replaced by removing a thumb screw from the support bracket on the interior of the panel.
 3. The alarm shall have a bright glow and flash during high water conditions. The alarm light will go out when the water level drops. Acknowledge alarm circuit (with buzzer) shall be provided to indicate an alarm condition. The buzzer shall be energized by either the alarm float switch or the alarm test switch and operate in conjunction with the alarm light. The buzzer shall be weatherproof and be rated for 85 DB at 10 feet. There shall be an exterior acknowledge switch that will silence the buzzer but allow the light to remain flashing during an alarm condition.
 4. All internal wiring shall be neat and color coded. Each wire shall be a different color or stripe (except for ground), and all incoming wires shall terminate into a box clamp type terminal block (except incoming power). All wires shall be 14GA. Type TEW rated for 105 degrees Celsius.

- 5. A schematic diagram (showing wire colors) shall be permanently fastened to the inside of the enclosure. An installation and service manual shall also be included with each control panel.
- C. U.L. Listing:
 - 1. The control panel shall be U.L. listed as an assembly.
- D. Control panel shall be furnished with water / gas tight pin & sleeve connectors for the pump, sensor, & float cables. Receptacles shall be mounted into the bottom of the control panel but within the area of the panel stand.

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.01 COORDINATION

- A. Pump stations in an existing system, being modified, replaced, or abandoned shall be coordinated with the operation of the Owner's existing sewer system so as to cause the least disruption to sewer service.
- B. Contractor shall coordinate with Owner as may be required for sequencing and timing or re-timing of existing pump stations in the Owner's system as may be affected by the Work.
- C. Contractor shall be responsible for providing and operating bypass pumping. No sanitary overflows will be allowed.

3.02 ERECTION

- A. Installation of the grinder pumps and related appurtenances shall be done in accordance with written instructions provided by the Manufacturer and as shown on the Drawings.
- B. The Manufacturer shall provide the services of a qualified field representative as required to perform startup of the grinder pumps and to instruct the Owner's operating personnel in the operation and maintenance of the equipment, as required by Owner or Engineer. A minimum of one 4-hour day shall be provided per pump station.
- C. The contractor shall touch-up all damaged coating surfaces with the compatible coating of identical color in a manner such that there shall be no evidence of damage.
- D. The equipment shall be erected in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. Required grout and leveling shims shall be provided by the Contractor.
- E. The Contractor shall strip the immediate area of organic material and stockpile the topsoil as directed by the Engineer.
- F. Excavation and backfill for each pump unit and force main shall conform to the requirements of Section 02200. All backfill shall be considered to be under pavement.
- G. All soil surface areas disturbed by the construction of the pump system shall be restored according to Section 02800.
- H. Pavement removed shall be replaced as scheduled or shown on the Drawings.

- I. The Contractor shall construct and maintain stilling basins with overflows to receive pumpage or surface drainage from excavation as required to prevent siltation to nearby streams and lakes.

3.03 INSPECTION, STARTUP, AND TESTING

- A. The Contractor shall furnish a representative of the manufacturer to perform inspection, startup, and training services. The manufacturer's representative shall be experienced in the operation and maintenance of the equipment.
- B. Initial lubrication required for start-up and field test operation shall be furnished and applied in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.
- C. The representative shall check the installation and supervise initial startup of the equipment. The representative shall certify that the installation is correct and that the equipment has operated satisfactorily. This service shall be provided for a minimum period of one trip and one day.
- D. After the installation and operation of the equipment has been certified, the manufacturer's representative shall train the Owner's personnel for one eight-hour day in the proper operation and maintenance of the equipment. The Owner may videotape the training.

3.04 PUMP STATION PERFORMANCE TESTING

- A. The Contractor shall perform all tests with clean water (no sewage will be allowed). The Contractor shall be responsible for providing water for all testing at no additional cost to the Owner.
 1. Pump(s) shall discharge through the force main system as planned.
 2. All downstream systems shall be able to appropriately handle the discharge.
- B. Run pumps continuously for a minimum of an hour before starting test. (Providing inflow as required):
 1. Turn all pump selector switches to the Off position.
 2. Fill Wet Well to just below inlet pipe. (Well may be filled higher if inlet pipe is plugged at Well).
 3. Measure water elevation.
 4. Start one pump and pump for a measured time period. (At least 3 minutes).
 5. Measure water elevation.
 6. Calculate volume pumped, flow rate, and pressure gauge recording. Check against pump curve.
 7. Repeat steps 2 through 6 three times for each pump.
- C. Pump Station and Telemetry Test:

1. Supply a steady flow to the station wet well at a rate less than the pump capacity. Confirm telemetering system is communicating.
2. Turn all pump selector switches to the Auto position. ~~Confirm telemetering indicates pumps are in Auto Mode.~~ **(Addendum 1, Issued 8/24/26)**
3. Turn the Lead Pump selector switch to the Pump One position. Let well fill to Lead Pump On position and measure water elevation. Confirm Pump One is running ~~and that telemetering indicates Pump One is running.~~ **(Addendum 1, Issued 8/24/26)** Let well empty to Pump Off position and measure water elevation. Confirm Pump One shuts off.
4. Turn Pump One selector switch to the Off position. Confirm telemetering indicates Pump One is not in Auto Mode. Let well fill to Lag Pump On position and measure water elevation. Confirm Pump Two is running ~~and that telemetering indicates Pump Two is running.~~ **(Addendum 1, Issued 8/24/26)** Turn Pump One selector switch to the Auto position. Confirm Pump One is running ~~and that telemetering indicates Pump One is running and in Auto Mode.~~ **(Addendum 1, Issued 8/24/26)** Let well empty to Pump Off position.
5. Confirm both pumps shut off.
6. Turn all pump selector switches to the Off position. Let well fill to High Water Alarm and measure water elevation and confirm that telemetering indicates High level.
7. ~~Make sure generator and automatic transfer switch are in the Auto position.~~
8. ~~Confirm that telemetering indicates service disconnect in closed position.~~
9. ~~Open disconnect and confirm that telemetering indicates disconnect in open position and power fail. Leave power off until automatic transfer switch starts generator and transfers power. Confirm that telemetering indicates Generator is running.~~
10. ~~Let station run on generator and repeat steps 2 through 9. Generator should run for at least 15 minutes.~~
11. ~~Turn selector switch of generator to the Off position. Allow generator fail alarm to activate and confirm that telemetering indicates Generator Fail.~~
12. ~~Turn selector switch of generator to the Auto position. Allow Generator to restart and run for 5 minutes.~~
13. ~~Close disconnect and let automatic transfer switch transfer power and stop generator. Confirm all telemetering signals.~~
14. ~~Simulate phase loss, intrusion, and authorized entry and confirm all telemetering signals.~~
15. ~~Simulate station out of service. Confirm upstream stations, as applicable to system, will not operate.~~

16. ~~Simulate downstream pump station out of service and check Enable Function prevents pumps from operating, where applicable.~~ (Addendum 1, Issued 8/24/26)

- A. Auto dialer shall be provided that shall send high water level, low water level and general pump fault alarms. AT&T cellular service shall be provided by the Village.
